


Chip Shot

Objective: To record how many points you can achieve by attempting to 'chip' the ball into an umbrella.

Equipment:

- Straight and flat playing area of 9m (i.e. garden, driveway)
- Foul and 'landing zone' lines (i.e. masking tape, chalk, rope)
- Chipping club
- Golf Ball
- Umbrella
- Measuring tape

Process: Place a 'foul line' in the playing area, measure out 5 metres and place the first 'landing zone' line, measure a further 4 metres and place the second 'landing zone' line. Then from the foul line measure out 7 metres and place the umbrella (*face down*) in the middle of the 'landing zone'.



Athletes should position themselves behind the foul line. The athlete should attempt to chip the ball into the umbrella. The athlete repeats this process a total of ten times.

Rules:

- The athlete must remain behind the foul line.
- The athlete has ten attempts.

Score:

- A swing and a miss counts as one attempt, the athlete receives a score of zero for that attempt.
- 1 point is scored for striking the ball.
- 2 points are scored if the ball lands inside the 'landing zone'.
- 3 points are scored if the ball comes to rest inside the umbrella.

The total number of points for all ten attempts are combined to calculate the athlete's final score, to be submitted (maximum of 30 points). See example below.
